Presenter Biographies

Dr. Carol Ann Baily (Keynote Speaker) has served at Middle Tennessee State University since 1993 as the Director of the Adult Services Center. She is also an adjunct instructor in French and teaches an on-line section of University 1010 (a student success course) each semester. Prior to that, Dr. Baily did corporate training, worked in continuing education and special projects training, and directed fund raising and alumni relations at several educational institutions. She received a doctorate in Higher Education Administration with an emphasis on adult learning as well as a Master's in French, both from Vanderbilt University. Her undergraduate degree was in French and German from Florida Presbyterian College, now known as Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, FL and included a two-year international experience at the Université de Neuchâtel in Switzerland.
